Introduction to the Search Term Booklet

Conducting structured literature reviews—especially systematic or scoping reviews—is a vital step in synthesising knowledge on complex and evolving topics like gender-based violence (GBV). Given the exponential growth in published research over recent decades, reviews play a critical role in reducing information overload and minimising bias. They help ensure that evidence is gathered and appraised transparently, allowing researchers and practitioners to identify knowledge gaps, assess the strength of existing findings, and inform policy, program design, or future studies. In areas like GBV, where ethical considerations, contextual diversity, and interdisciplinary insights are paramount, well-designed reviews also promote methodological rigour and inclusivity. Whether you are exploring risk factors, interventions, or lived experiences, a robust review can provide a reliable foundation for action and advocacy.

This booklet is designed to support researchers, practitioners, and students conducting reviews and literature searches related to GBV. Whether you are working on a systematic review, a scoping study, or exploratory research, this resource provides structured search terms, strategic guidance, and database-specific tips to help you build effective, context-sensitive searches.

This booklet is designed to support the search strategy when conducting a review. It provides curated, searchable terms for each element of PEO, along with Intervention terminology from PICO, and tips on database syntax like wildcards and proximity operators. By combining technical guidance with inclusive, ready-to-use language, the booklet enables users to build clear, comprehensive, and adaptable search strategies for GBV-related research across different platforms.

Think of this as a puzzle toolkit—not a one-size-fits-all recipe. Pull together search terms and syntax that best suit your research question, population, and context. Combine freely across population, exposure, and outcome terms to refine your search. Use this resource flexibly and creatively—and remember to adapt your strategy to each database's unique rules and strengths.

Language Inclusion & Community Contribution

In response to feedback from international colleagues, organisations, and members of the Gender Violence Research and Collaboration Network (GVRCN), future editions in other languages will be released. This is part of our commitment to making GBV research more inclusive, accessible, and globally representative.

The booklet is designed to be openly accessible and can be **freely downloaded**, shared, and translated into other languages as needed. We encourage users around the world to adapt the content for local research contexts. In addition, under each subgroup heading, you will find a downloadable link for the search terms pre-populated into search strings for some of the major academic databases.

What is PEO?

We use the PEO framework (Population–Exposure–Outcome) as our guiding structure to help frame research questions and organise relevant search terms. This approach is particularly useful for qualitative and interdisciplinary GBV research where definitions and populations are diverse and intersectional.

P – Population	E – Exposure	O – Outcome
Who is affected by the issue? e.g., children, politically active women, LGBTQ+ individuals, migrants	What kind of violence or experience are they exposed to? e.g., online abuse, intimate partner violence, violence in conflict zones	What are the consequences? e.g., mental health impacts, physical harm, school dropout, job loss

What is PICO?

In addition to PEO, we also incorporate the 'I' - Intervention - from PICO, in our guidebook. PICO (Population–Intervention–Comparator–Outcome) is a structured framework used to formulate research questions and organise search terms, particularly for studies evaluating the effectiveness of specific interventions. This approach is especially useful for GBV intervention research where you need to assess "what works"—comparing specific programs, services, or strategies against alternatives or control conditions to determine their impact on measurable outcomes.

P – Population	I – Intervention	C – Comparator	O - Outcome
Who is affected by the issue? e.g., children, politically active women, LGBTQ+ individuals, migrants	What is being done to address the issue? e.g., counseling services, legal advocacy, shelter programs, community education, economic empowerment, policy reforms	What is it being compared against? e.g., no intervention, standard care, alternative programs, pre-intervention baseline, different delivery methods	What are the consequences? e.g., mental health impacts, physical harm, school dropout, job loss

A Note on PEO and Other Frameworks to define your Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria

While this booklet is structured around the PEO (Population-Exposure-Outcome) & PICO (Population-Intervention-Comparators-Outcome) framework, it is important to recognise that PEO & PICO are just two of several models used to build effective research questions and search strategies.

Depending on your research focus and methodology, you might also use:

- SPIDER – Sample, Phenomenon of Interest, Design, Evaluation, Research type (Often used in qualitative and mixed-methods research.)
- CoCoPop Framework (for Prevalence/Incidence Reviews) - Condition (disease, etc.), Context, Population

****The guidebook does not feature comparator terminology as a distinct category, as any term within the book can function as a comparator.****

General Note on Academic Databases

When conducting academic literature searches—especially on complex topics like GBV—using the right databases is crucial. Academic databases are curated collections of scholarly literature, including peer-reviewed journal articles, books, reports, theses, and conference proceedings. They offer powerful tools such as Boolean logic, truncation, subject headings, and filters that help you refine your search and improve relevance and accuracy.

Each database has its own structure, search capabilities, and strengths. Understanding the scope and functionality of each will help you build effective search strategies.

Commonly Used Academic Databases for GBV and Social Research

Database	Focus/Strength
PubMed	Biomedical and public health research. Great for health-related aspects of GBV, which includes MEDLINE.
Scopus	Broad, multidisciplinary database covering science, health, social sciences, and more. Useful for citation tracking.
Web of Science	Multidisciplinary and strong in citation analysis. Covers social sciences and health, including Social Science Citation Index.
APA Psycarticles	Psychology and behavioural sciences. Essential for research on trauma, abuse, mental health, etc., including PsycINFO.
Sociological Abstracts	Key for sociological studies, including gender, family, and violence.
CINAHL	Nursing and allied health literature. Valuable for community health and clinical perspectives on GBV.
ERIC	Education-focused. Useful for school-based violence, youth, and gender studies.
Embase	Biomedical database with more European content. Good complement to PubMed.
JSTOR	Humanities and social science archives. Strong for theoretical, historical, and feminist research.
Academic Search Complete	General academic coverage, useful for broad exploratory searches.
Applied Social Science Index and Abstracts (ASSIA)	Database that indexes and abstracts articles from journals in health, social services, psychology, sociology, economics, politics, race relations, and education.

Regional and Non-English Academic Databases

To ensure more inclusive and globally representative reviews—especially for cross-cultural or regional GBV topics—it is important to explore regional and non-English databases. These platforms often include locally produced research, grey literature, or studies not indexed in major English-language databases.

Key Regional & Multilingual Databases

Database	Region/Language	Focus
LILACS (Latin American and Caribbean Health Sciences Literature)	Latin America	Health, social sciences, and local public health issues
SciELO (Scientific Electronic Library Online)	Latin America, Spain, Portugal, South Africa	Multidisciplinary, peer-reviewed journals
Redalyc	Latin America, Spain	Humanities and social sciences
CNKI (China National Knowledge Infrastructure)	China	Comprehensive coverage in Chinese (science, medicine, social sciences)
Wanfang Data	China	Health, social sciences, medicine
KISS (Korean Studies Information Service System)	Korea	Social sciences, humanities
J-STAGE	Japan	Scientific and medical research from Japanese institutions
AIM (African Index Medicus)	Africa	Public health and medicine from African perspectives
IndMED	India	Biomedical literature produced in India
Russian Science Citation Index	Russia	Scholarly research in Russian across disciplines

Tip: Many regional databases allow for searching in both the native language and English. Use translated keywords and controlled vocabulary when possible.

Search Syntax Tips: Truncation, Wildcards & Proximity Operators

Note on Truncation (*)

Use an asterisk (*) to capture multiple word endings or variations of a root word. This is helpful to broaden your search. For example:

girl* will include: girl, girls

orphan* will include: orphan, orphans, orphaned

adult* will include: adult, adults

LGBT* will include: LGBT, LGBTQ, LGBTQIA+, etc.

Always check your database's truncation rules—some may use *, ?, or another symbol.

Note on UK vs US Spelling Variations

Use wildcards or OR statements to account for differences in British and American English spelling. Common approaches:

1. Truncation with wildcards inside the word

Some databases support wildcards within words to replace variable characters:

p?ediatric → captures both paediatric and pediatric

behavio?r → captures behavior and behaviour

Note: Not all databases support internal wildcards. Check if your platform allows ? or # as a single-character wildcard.

2. Using explicit OR statements

For precision, especially in databases without internal wildcards:
(paediatric OR pediatric)

(behaviour OR behavior)

(labour OR labor)

(counselling OR counseling)

This ensures both versions are picked up.

Search Syntax Tips: Truncation, Wildcards & Proximity Operators Cont.

Note on NEAR/5

NEAR/5 is a proximity operator used in some databases (like Scopus, Embase, and others) to find words that appear within 5 words of each other, in any order.

Example:

(social media NEAR/5 harassment)

This search term will retrieve results where "social media" and "harassment" occur within 5 words of each other, such as:

“harassment on social media platforms”

“social media has been a source of harassment”

When to use:

Use NEAR/x when you want to capture contextually related terms that may not be directly adjacent but are closely linked in meaning.

Replace x with any number depending on how close you want the terms to be (e.g., NEAR/3, NEAR/10).

Search Syntax Tips (Quick Reference)

Use this page as a one-stop cheat sheet for the search commands you will meet most often when building GBV search strategies in major academic databases.

Truncation (*)

What it does	When to use	Where it works
Finds any ending of a word stem.	Capture plurals or multiple endings without typing them all.	* in Scopus, Web of Science, Ovid (MEDLINE, Embase, PsycINFO ...), EBSCO (CINAHL, ERIC ...), ProQuest, NHS HDAS. Ovid also accepts \$ as an alias.

Example adolescen* ⇒ adolescent, adolescents, adolescence

Tip: In thesaurus-based databases (e.g., MEDLINE), search the full word first to see the suggested subject heading; then add your truncated keyword line.

Wildcards (? / #)

Symbol	What it replaces	Common platforms
?	Exactly one character (Scopus, Web of Science, EBSCO).	(wom?n → woman / women)
#	Zero or one character (Ovid, EBSCO).	(p#ediatric → paediatric / pediatric)

Why it matters: Great for UK/US spelling differences or singular/plural shifts without overshooting with full truncation.

Proximity / Adjacency

Operator	Typical platforms	How it reads
NEAR/x	Web of Science, ProQuest	either word within x words (any order)
W/x	Scopus	first term within x words before the second
PRE/x	Scopus	first term must precede the second by \leq x words
ADJx	Ovid (MEDLINE, Embase ...)	either order, \leq x words apart
N x	EBSCO (CINAHL, ERIC ...)	either order, \leq x words apart

Example (Web of Science): child NEAR/3 abuse → retrieves “abuse of the child”, “child physical abuse”, “child severe emotional abuse”.

Search Syntax Tips (Quick Reference) Cont.

Phrase Searching ("...")

What it does	Typical symbol
Forces words to appear exactly together, in order .	Double quotes in almost all databases (default in Ovid)

Use for precise concepts—e.g., "**intimate partner violence**"—but remember it can exclude relevant variations. Combine with proximity when you need flexibility.

Use **NOT** (or **AND NOT** in Scopus) to remove unwanted concepts carefully—e.g., exclude animal-only studies or publication types.

Safe method (Cochrane style)

1. Build your main set.
2. Build an exclusion set (e.g., exp animals/ NOT humans.sh.)
3. Main Set NOT Exclusion Set → keeps human + mixed studies, drops animal-only.

Subject Headings vs. Keywords

Why combine both?

Subject headings (e.g., MeSH, CINAHL Headings) guarantee you capture articles no matter how authors phrase the concept.

Keywords (free text) catch emerging terms not yet in the thesaurus and handle regional spellings.

Shortcut syntax

- Ovid: exp child exploitation/ (exploded), *child exploitation/ (major topic)
- CINAHL: MH "child exploitation+", MM "child exploitation+"

Using the PEO & PICO Framework to Structure GBV Searches

The PEO framework—Population, Exposure, Outcome—, or the PICO framework—Population, Intervention, Comparator, Outcome— is a helpful tool for structuring focused, answerable questions, especially in qualitative and social research. It's especially effective for topics like GBV where context, population, and outcomes are diverse and intersectional.

This approach helps ensure clarity, relevance, and comprehensiveness in your search strategy.

Population

Think broadly and inclusively when defining your population.

Consider:

- General populations (children, adolescents, elderly)
- Gender-diverse individuals (LGBTQ+, trans, non-binary)
- Politically active women (activists, candidates)
- Context-specific groups (refugees, migrants, people with disabilities)

These distinctions ensure your search reflects intersectionality and contextual risk factors.

Using the PEO & PICO Framework to Structure GBV Searches

Cont.

Intervention

Consider the full spectrum of GBV prevention and response interventions:

Consider:

Prevention interventions:

- Community mobilisation and awareness campaigns
- Educational programs (school-based, community-based)
- Economic empowerment initiatives
- Engaging men and boys programs
- Policy and legislative reforms
- Social norm change interventions

Response interventions:

- Clinical care (medical, mental health, psychosocial support)
- Legal services and justice system responses
- Shelter and safe housing programs
- Case management and referral services
- Survivor advocacy and support groups
- Multi-sectoral coordinated responses (one-stop centres, coordinated community response)

Multi-level approaches:

- Individual-level interventions
- Relationship/family-level interventions
- Community-level interventions
- Institutional/organisational interventions
- Policy/structural interventions

Using the PEO & PICO Framework to Structure GBV Searches

Cont.

Exposure (Type of Violence)

This booklet focuses on three primary types of exposure: **online violence, offline violence, and violence in humanitarian settings**. However, these are not exhaustive. We encourage you to approach this booklet with a 'puzzle mindset': select and combine search terms across different exposure categories to best fit the specific needs of your research question.

- **Online Violence:** Examples: cyberstalking, doxxing, image-based abuse, online misogyny
- **Offline Violence:** Examples: intimate partner violence, sexual assault, reproductive coercion, FGM
- **Violence in Humanitarian Settings:** Examples: conflict-related sexual violence, exploitation in displacement camps, GBV among refugees

Each theme can be explored with its own tailored search terms, using proximity operators, truncation, and platform-specific syntax (see our "**Search Syntax Tips**" page).

Using the PEO & PICO Framework to Structure GBV Searches

Cont.

Comparator

Think critically about what you're comparing your intervention against to understand effectiveness and impact.

Consider:

No Intervention/Control Groups

- Pure control - No intervention provided during study period
- Waitlist control - Delayed intervention (control group receives intervention after study completion)
- Attention control - Non-specific attention/contact without active GBV intervention components
- Placebo control - Activities that mimic intervention structure but lack key therapeutic elements

Standard/Usual Care

- Existing services - Whatever GBV services are currently available in the setting
- Treatment as usual - Standard protocols or guidelines already in place
- Routine referral - Basic referral to available services without enhanced intervention
- Minimal intervention - Information provision only (pamphlets, hotline numbers)

Alternative Active Interventions

- Different intervention types - Comparing different GBV intervention approaches (e.g., psychotherapy vs. support groups)
- Different modalities - Individual vs. group vs. couples/family interventions
- Different delivery methods - In-person vs. digital/telehealth vs. community-based
- Different sectors - Health sector vs. legal sector vs. social services vs. multi-sectoral
- Different theoretical frameworks - Trauma-focused vs. empowerment-based vs. feminist vs. ecological models

Using the PEO & PICO Framework to Structure GBV Searches

Cont.

Outcome

We have centred this booklet around three key outcome areas: **mental health (e.g., PTSD, anxiety, depression)**, **physical and reproductive health (e.g., chronic pain, injuries, reproductive trauma)**, and **educational, political and economic impacts (e.g., school dropout, loss of employment, economic dependency)**. These categories are not comprehensive. Think of them as starting points—use them flexibly and combine terms as needed to reflect the outcomes most relevant to your research focus. This booklet aims to be updated once a year, and future versions may incorporate additional outcomes.

Outcomes describe the impact of exposure.

Consider:

- **Mental health:** PTSD, anxiety, depression
- **Physical & reproductive health:** chronic pain, injuries, reproductive trauma
- **Educational, political & economic:** school dropout, loss of employment, dependency

Outcomes can be searched directly (e.g., "psychological trauma") or explored through subject headings in databases like CINAHL and MEDLINE.

About These Search Terms: A Note on Overlap and Flexibility

Throughout this guidebook, you will notice that certain search terms appear across multiple population, exposure, and outcome subgroups. This overlap is intentional and reflects the intersectional, contextual nature of gender-based violence research.

Why terms appear in multiple categories:

Terms are duplicated across subgroups to acknowledge that:

- Intersectionality matters. A search term related to intimate partner violence, for example, may be equally relevant when searching for violence affecting LGBTQ+ individuals, disabled persons, or refugees. Rather than creating separate lists, we recognise these overlaps to encourage researchers to apply population-specific lenses across all exposure types.
- Context shapes terminology. The same violent act or outcome may be described differently depending on the setting—whether online, offline, or in humanitarian contexts. Search terms are repeated where relevant to ensure comprehensive coverage across all contexts you may be investigating.
- Flexibility is key. This approach supports the "puzzle mindset" described earlier: you are encouraged to select, combine, and adapt terms freely based on your specific research question, rather than adhering to a rigid, one-size-fits-all structure.

How to use this resource:

- Treat duplicated terms as signals that they may be particularly useful across multiple dimensions of your search strategy.
- Combine terms from different subgroups to build more nuanced search strings that capture intersectional experiences.
- Adapt and omit terms as needed—this resource is a toolkit, not a prescription.

Remember, the goal is comprehensive, inclusive searching that reflects the complexity of gender-based violence across diverse populations and contexts.
